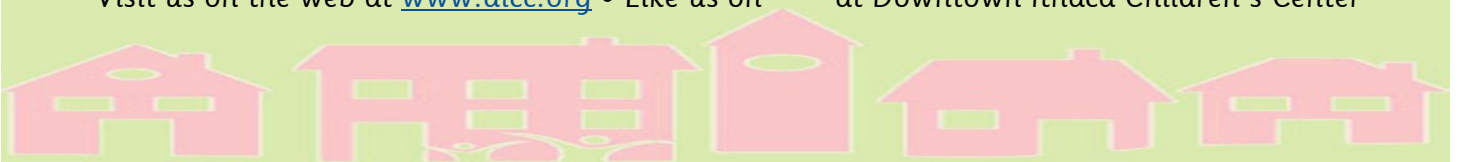
**DICC School Pictures on November 7th**

### Blue Room

The infants are working on independence. They are learning to become more self-sufficient in regards to holding their bottles, crawling, sitting up and general independent play. We are excited to be welcoming two new babies within the next couple weeks .
