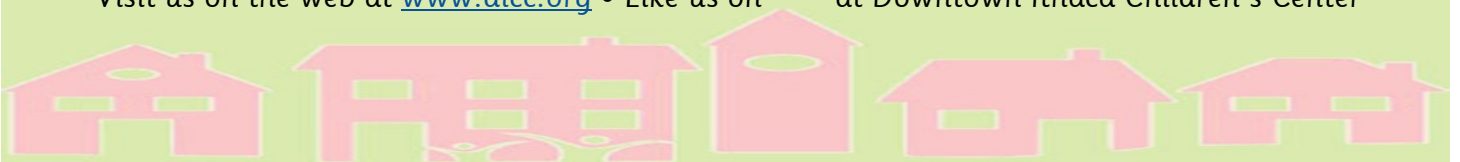

Dragonfly Room.

The Dragonfly Room welcomes Meriel (Ithaca College student). We are excited to explore all of the literacy activities she will be bringing into the classroom. Our class has also welcomed many new faces, which has brought changes to our daily routine. Mindfulness, patience and love are a few of the aspects that make our transitions possible.

Firefly Room

They are sharing stories about themselves and learning to accept each other and others ideas. Our theme is "All About Me" we are going back to "baby hood" and the kids are playing baby, visiting the baby room and participating in some fun activities- Baby food tasting, playing the parent, and caring for baby dolls in the room. They are also learning about themselves and how their bodies have developed from babies to who they are now and what they are capable of doing now. The discussions between the kids have been awesome!
