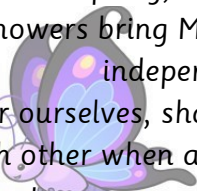

- What letters make up my name ?

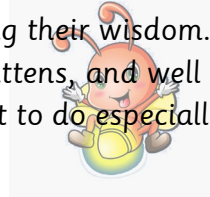


Lastly, it has been our goal to get outside at least once a day. So far we've been succeeding! Catch the grasshoppers outdoors rain, shine, snow or sleet!

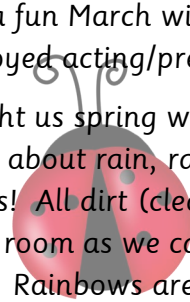

Staff Development Update: See Children and Name Their Strengths

Reinforcing language allows teachers and parents to support children so that children learn their own and other children's strengths, Paula Denton remind us in The Power of Our Words. This is simple and it is hard. The simple part is using our adult words to name leading edge behaviors. This is different than PRAISE. This is describing what a child did that helped other children or other people. To do this well, we all need to practice by:

- Naming concrete, specific behaviors;
- Using our warm adult voices and tone.
- Find positives to name in all children.

Do not name other children's behaviors as examples for others
