Caterpillar Room

Hello everyone! We are having a wonderful spring in the Caterpillar Room. The children are having lots of fun playing and being outside. With the summer just around the corner, please remember to bring sunscreen and a sun hat for your child.

In the month of May, the Caterpillars will be focusing on insects and crawly bugs. We will introduce the children to all the various types of bugs they might see on a daily basis through circle time, art projects, books and songs. Toward the end of this month we will learn about garden tools.

We are also put some flowers in our mini garden just outside of our classroom. We hope that the colorful flowers will attract some beautiful butterflies later in the summer so we will be able to see them from our window. For sensory time the children will have an opportunity to smell and feel soft flower petals and touch smooth and fuzzy new green leaves.

The Butterflies have welcomed two new friends this month! We are also working on social emotional skills such as learning to be a good friend, manners, sharing, talking about our feelings and being mindful listeners.

Some reminders we have for the parents are to make sure their child has comfortable walking shoes/sandals with straps, as we will be doing more outdoor activities. We provide sunscreen however, if there is a preference for a specific brand, we ask that the parents supply this. The last reminder is to bring in extra clothes and bathing suits. The children do get messy and with the warmer weather they may even get wet.

Our class is also planning some upcoming field trips and we ask that if there are any parents/guardians who are interested in chaperoning, to please give us days of the week and times that they are available to do so.

Staff Development Update: Reminding Language

Paula Denton gives us seven bullet points in *The Power of Our Words* so we can be effective when we remind children (and maybe adults) without sounding impatient.

- Start by establishing expectations early.
- Phrase a reminder as a question or a statement.
- Use a direct tone and neutral body language.
- Use reminders proactively and reactively.
- Use reminders when the child and you are both calm.
- Keep reminders brief. (I would put that one at the top of the list.)
- Watch for follow-through.
